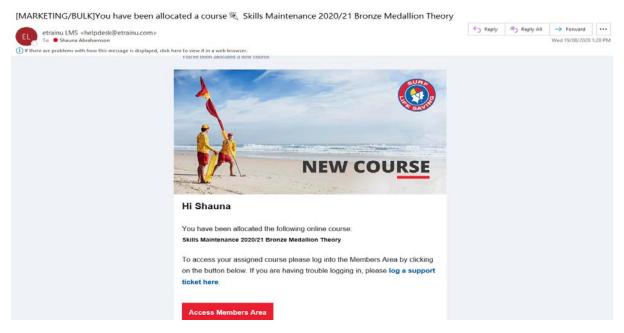


Instructions for 2020/2021 season Skills Maintenance (Proficiency).

Welcome to the 2020/21 Skills Maintenance (Proficiency). This year Skills Maintenance will be a little different to previous years; there will still be a practical component (this year will be a run swim run only- with dates listed at the bottom of this handout and sent out via SurfGuard) and a theory component that this year will be conducted online. This handout is to assist you with accessing the online theory component of your Skills Maintenance.

You should have all by now received an email (see the screenshot below from etrainu- mine was sent out 19 August) directing you to the Skills Maintenance Theory component of your Proficiency.



If however you are unable to find the email, please don't worry- you just need to get into the Members Area of SLS Australia as shown below.

Enter "SLS Australia Member Area" into the search field.

Note: you will need to have your own personal Members Area Username and Password (if you are registered as a family it may require you to create individual usernames and passwords for those in your family that need to complete Skills Maintenance).

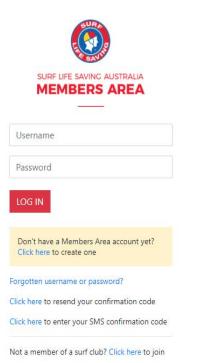




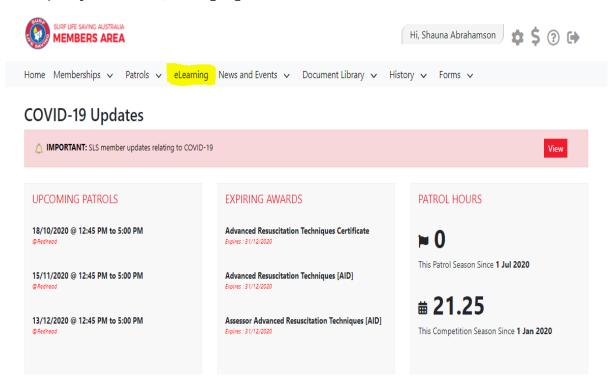






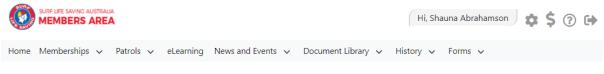


Once you've logged in to the Members Are click on eLearning (the third tab across the top of your screen). As highlighted below.





You will then need to click on "Login to eLearning" as highlighted below.



SLSA eLearning

Surf Life Saving Australia (SLSA) has a number of online courses available to support members in completing their SLSA awards in a more flexible manner. Currently online courses are available in the following streams: Aquatic Search and Rescue, Emergency Care, Beach Management and Powercraft. There are also Safety and Wellbeing, Skills Maintenance and Age Managers options available to be completed online.

The online courses available typically cover the theory components and are designed in many cases to be completed in conjunction with a course Learner Guide which you can access from the SLSA Members Area Library. In most cases you will also participate in practical training activities and assessments organised by your surf lifesaving club or SLS state/territory centre to achieve competency in the SLSA award.

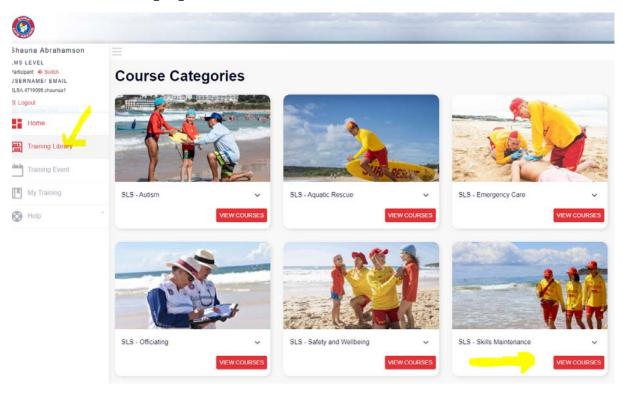
An online version of the SLSA eLearning User Guide can be found within the SLSA IT Helpdesk Online Help Library.

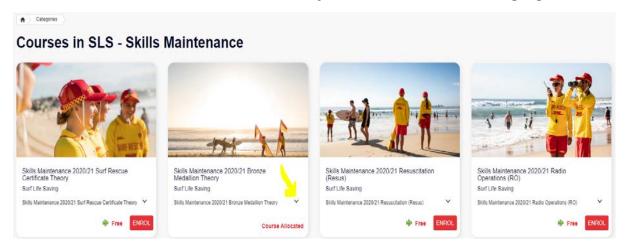


It may take a moment to load but you will then need to click on "Training Library" to the left of your screen. This will open your course categories- Choose "SLS- Skills Maintenance" as highlighted below.

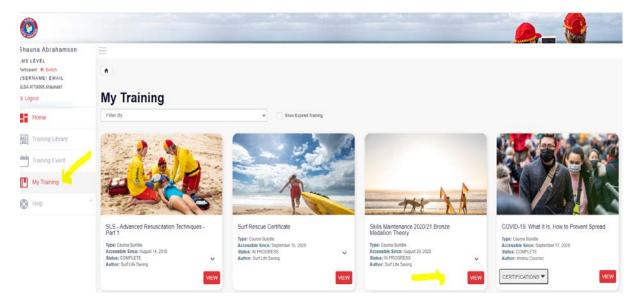




This will bring up Courses in SLS- Skills Maintenance. Your required Skills Maintenance course should already have been allocated to you, if not you will need to select the "Enrol" tab, otherwise click on the arrow in your allocated course as highlighted.



Now that you have checked to see that your Skills Maintenance course has been allocated to you or you have enrolled in the appropriate course you need to click on "my Training" that can be found down the left of your screen. This will bring up "My Training" and should have "Skills Maintenance 2020/21 Bronze Medallion Theory" listed (or the course that you are required to maintain). See highlighted below.

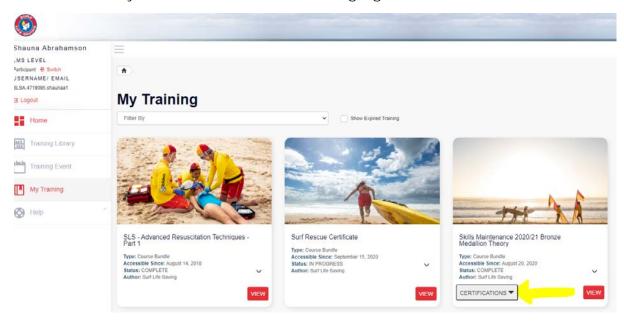




Skills Maintenance 2020/21 Bronze Medallion Theory is comprised of 7 components:

- Introduction 2020/21 (approx. 4 minutes)
- Mental Health Awareness 2020/21 (approx. 15 minutes)
- Online Radio (approx. 24 minutes)
- Online Signals (approx. 8 minutes)
- Online Resuscitation (approx. 23 minutes)
- Tourniquets and Spinal Management 2020/21 (approx. 15 minutes)
- Theory Questions (approx. 10 minutes)

After completing each section click on the "exit" button in the top left of the screen. Once you have completed all 7 components your "My Training" summary screen will have a "Certifications" tab now included for Skills Maintenance 2020/21 Bronze Medallion Theory. Click on "Certifications" as highlighted below.



This will provide you with a "Certificate of Completion". Please ensure you save this certificate and Print it off to bring along to the Practical Component of your Skills Maintenance. If you experience any difficulties printing your completion Certificate, please contact me via text on 0412 530 522.
